## A PROCLAMATION

[1389]

By His Excellency THE HONOURABLE PETER GEORGE UNDERWOOD, Officer of the Order of Australia, Governor in and over the State of Tasmania and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by his Proclamation issued on 22 February 2008 the previous Governor, His Excellency THE HONOURABLE WILLIAM JOHN ELLIS COX, Companion of the Order of Australia, fixed 2.30 p.m. on Tuesday 4 March 2008, in the Houses of Parliament situated in the City of Hobart in Tasmania, as the time and place that the Parliament of Tasmania shall assemble for the despatch of business:

AND WHEREAS the Second Session of the Forty-Sixth Parliament of Tasmania commenced at the abovementioned time and place, and remains in session:

AND WHEREAS section 12(1) of the *Constitution Act 1934* provides that the Governor shall fix the times and places for holding the sessions of Parliament, and may alter or vary the same respectively as he may think fit, giving due notice thereof:

AND WHEREAS in order to facilitate the carrying out of certain works for the upgrading, restoration and conservation of the House of Assembly Chamber and other works to proceed I think it fitting that sittings of the current Session of the House of Assembly of the said Parliament be held during the period from 19 to 21 August 2008 and during the period from 26 to 28 August 2008 in the building known as the Albert Hall situated in the City of Launceston in Tasmania and during the period from 23 to 25 September 2008 in the building known as the Burnie Civic Centre situated in the City of Burnie in Tasmania:

NOW THEREFORE I, THE HONOURABLE PETER GEORGE UNDERWOOD, Officer of the Order of Australia, Governor in and over the State of Tasmania and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, exercising the power and authority vested in me, do hereby give notice that I fix 10.00 a.m. on 19 August 2008 and 10.00 a.m. on 26 August 2008 in the building known as the Albert Hall situated in the City of Launceston in Tasmania and 10.00 a.m. on 23 September 2008 in the building known as the Burnie Civic Centre situated in the City of Burnie in Tasmania as the times and places at which the House of Assembly of the said Parliament shall sit for the despatch of business and, when the said House has completed its business at the abovementioned places during the said periods, thereafter to sit for the remainder of the said Second Session in the building known as Parliament House situated in the City of Hobart in Tasmania, and the members of the said House are hereby required to give their attendance at the same times and places accordingly.
