GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *State Service (Restructuring) Order 2008*

This order effects a restructuring of the State Service by –

- (a) amalgamating Tourism Tasmania and Events Tasmania with the Department of Economic Development and renaming that department as the Department of Economic Development and Tourism; and
- (b) renaming the Department of Tourism, Arts and the Environment as the Department of Environment, Parks, Heritage and the Arts.

(2) *State Service (Agencies and Heads of Agencies) Order 2008*

This order amends Schedule 1 to the *State Service Act 2000* consequential on the change of names of the Department of Economic Development and the Department of Tourism, Arts and the Environment.

(3) *Administrative Arrangements Order 2008*

This order –

- (a) assigns to Ministers of the Crown the administration of enactments; and
- (b) specifies which Government department or State authority is responsible to which Minister in relation to the administration of those enactments.
