Research area

3 .The following part of State waters (on the east coast of Tasmania approximately adjacent to the north east of Grants Point) is declared to be a research area:

All waters within an imaginary line commencing at the intersection of the high-water mark and the line of longitude 148° 20' 11.95" East on the northern side of Grants Point; then to latitude 41° 14' 47.6" South, longitude 148° 20' 27.4" East; to latitude 41° 14' 48.1" South, longitude 148° 20' 38.5" East; to latitude 41° 15' 26.51" South, longitude 148° 20' 41.4" East; then due West to the high-water mark.

Restrictions on taking fish in the research area

4. The following restrictions on fishing are declared to apply in the research area referred to in clause (3).

A person must not –

- (a) take any fish by swimming or by diving beneath the surface of State waters; or
- (b) set or use a rock lobster pot, rock lobster ring; or
- (c) possess rock lobster marked in the tail fan with two separate and distinct holes that are at least 5 millimetres in diameter or having blue and yellow markings which will be visible within the muscle tissue on the under side of the tail.

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Proclamation under section 2 of the Commonwealth Powers (De Facto Relationships) Act 2006

This proclamation fixes 8 October 2008 as the day on which the Commonwealth Powers (De Facto Relationships) Act 2006 commences.

(2) Threatened Species Protection Order (No. 2) 2008

This order amends the Threatened Species Protection Act 1995 by-

- (a) adding certain species to, and omitting certain species from, the Schedules of endangered, vulnerable and rare flora and fauna; and
- (b) updating a common name reference in the Schedule of rare flora and fauna.

(3) Justices Amendment Rules 2008

These rules of court amend the *Justices Rules 2003* by providing that justices may allow a written statement or report to be tendered or treated as a person's evidence in chief.

(4) Magistrates Court (Civil Division) Amendment (Written Evidence) Rules 2008

These rules of court amend the *Magistrates Court (Civil Division) Rules 1998* by providing that the Magistrates Court may allow a written statement or report to be tendered or treated as a witness's evidence in chief.
