Constitution of the North West Autism Services

A controlling authority of the Burnie City Council established under section 29 *Local Government Act 1993*

1. The Authority

The controlling authority is the "North West Autism Services" ("NWAS").

2. Name

The name of the controlling authority is "North West Autism Services" ("NWAS").

3. Functions

- 3.1 The Authority has the following functions:
- 3.1.1 To provide access to early intervention services and support for eligible children with a disability, their parents, carers and families to help such children achieve their potential.
- 3.2 In carrying out its functions the Authority is to do so within any relevant guidelines specified by the body or bodies that fund the NWAS.

4. Powers

The Authority has the power to:

- (a) employ staff;
- (b) provide services to children with ASD;
- (c) to accept donations and to raise money;
- (d) to charge fees for the provision of the services provided by NWAS.
- (e) to submit applications for grants and requests for funding.

5. Directors & Members

- 5.1 The Authority is to be managed by a board of directors who shall consist of:
 - (a) the aldermen of the Council;
 - (b) the General Manager and the Director Community and Economic Development;
 - (c) the Authority's Director of the North West Autism Services is an ex officio member of the Board.
- 5.2 The Mayor will be the Chairman of the Board and the Deputy Mayor is to be the Deputy Chairman.

6. Term of Office

- 6.1 Unless terminated in accordance with clause 6.3, the term of office of a director:
- 6.1.1 is until the close of the Council's first normal meeting after Council elections; and
- 6.1.2 until the Director Community and Economic Development ceases to hold that position or until the General Manager terminates that person's directorship.
- 6.2 The office of any director immediately ceases if the director:
- 6.2.1 is removed from membership of the Authority by the Council under section 29(3); or
- 6.2.2 becomes bankrupt; or
- 6.2.3 dies.
- 6.3 Notwithstanding clause 6.2, a director may resign before

completion of their term of office by giving 60 days notice in writing to the Chairman.

7. Officers and Executive

- 7.1 The Board may establish an executive committee to make urgent decisions between ordinary meetings of the Board
- 7.2 If the Board establishes an executive committee it must consist of:
- 7.2.1 the General Manager or his nominee;
- 7.2.2 not more than 2 other directors elected by the Board; and
- 7.2.3 the Authority's Director.

8. Declaration of Interest

8.1 The provisions of sections 48-56 of the Act apply to the directors as if they were all Councillors.

9. Financial Statements and Reports

- 9.1 The Authority is to provide a report on its activities for each financial year and to do so within 90 days of the end of the financial year.
- 9.2 The Authority is to maintain appropriate accounting records and must provide to the Council an audited set of accounts within 90 days of the end of each financial year.
- 9.3 The Board is to promptly notify the General Manager and the Mayor of anything that may:
- 9.3.1 prevent or significantly adversely affect the achievement of any objective under a strategic plan, business plan that has been adopted by the Authority; or
- 9.3.2 significantly adversely affect the operating ability of the Authority.

10. Limitations on Authority's Powers

- 10.1 The Authority does not have the power to:
- 10.1.1 make a rate; or
- 10.1.2 make a bylaw;
- 10.1.3 borrow money or raise any loan
- 10.1.4 buy or sell real estate; or
- 10.1.5 take a lease over any real estate; or
- 10.1.6 institute or defend any legal proceeding.

11. Meetings

- 11.1 Meetings of the Board are to be conducted in such normal form as is conducive to the conduct of its business as the Board decides.
- 11.2 The Board may conduct its meetings in accordance with the Local Government (Meeting Procedures) Regulations 2005.
- 11.3 The quorum of meetings of the Board is one half of the directors.
- 11.4 The Board may pass resolutions, call meetings and meet in the same manner as directors are able to in accordance with Part 2G.1 of the Corporations Act.
- 11.5 The Chairman, and in the Chairman's absence, the Deputy Chairman is to chair meetings of the Authority.
- 11.6 If neither the Chairman nor the Deputy Chairman

- is available to chair all or any part of a meeting the directors present are to elect one of their directors to act as Chair of that meeting or part of it.
- 11.7 Each director has 1 vote at all meetings. The Chairman does not have a casting vote.

12. Notice of Meetings

- 12.1 Notice of the date, place and time of all Board meetings is to be given to all directors at least seven days in advance unless the Chairman determines that an urgent matter requires shorter notice.
- 12.2 A notice setting out the places, dates and times of all Board meetings for any period up to a year and given to all directors and the General Manager is sufficient notice of the meetings held in accordance with that notice
- 12.3 Notices of meetings may be given by telephone, facsimile, e-mail or post.

13. Sub-Committees, Advisory Committees & Delegation

- 13.1 The Board may appoint subcommittees, working parties and advisory committees and determine their membership, procedures and functions.
- 13.2 A working party, or advisory committee may include any person but must have at least one director who is appointed to the working party or advisory committee.
- 13.3 Sub-committees, working parties and advisory committees may only investigate and report to the Board.

14. Minutes

- 14.1 The Board is to keep or cause to be kept minutes of all meetings of the Board, Sub Committees, Working Parties, Advisory Boards, and any advisory committee detailing:
 - 14.1.1 time, date and place of the meeting; and
 - 14.1.2 those present; and
 - 14.1.3 an accurate record of all motions, including mover and seconder and whether it is "carried" or "lost".
- 14.2 The minutes of each meeting are to be confirmed at the next meeting of the same nature.
- 14.3 Unconfirmed minutes of meetings of subcommittees, working parties and advisory Committees are to be given to the Board within 7 days of those meetings.
- 14.4 Unconfirmed minutes of meetings of the Board are to be given to the General Manager within 7 days of the meeting.
- 14.5 Confirmed minutes are to be provided for inclusion in the Agenda of the Council Meeting.

15. Insurances

- 15.1 The Council will ensure that its insurances will cover the Authority, its directors and its employees to the same extent as if they were Councillors or employees of the Council with respect to:
 - 15.1.1 personal accident; and
 - 15.1.2 public liability; and
 - 15.1.3 professional indemnity; and

15.1.4 directors and officers.

16. Amendment

16.1 This constitution can be amended by resolution of the Council.

17. Execution of Documents

17.1 Any documents to be executed by the Authority must be signed on behalf of the Authority by the Chairman or Deputy Chairman, and one other Director.

18. Validation

18.1 A decision or action of the Authority is not invalid merely because it does not comply with clause 11.3.

19. Definitions

- 19.1 In this constitution, unless inconsistent with the context.
 - 19.1.1 a reference to the Act is a reference to the Local Government Act 1993;
 - 19.1.2 "ASD" means Autism Spectrum Disorders;
 - 19.1.3 "Authority" means the controlling authority known as "North West Autism Services";
 - 19.1.4 "Board" means the Authority's directors meeting as a Board of Directors of the Authority;
 - 19.1.5 "City" means the municipal area of the Council;
 - 19.1.6 "Council" means the Burnie City Council;
 - 19.1.7 "Councillor" has the same meaning as that term in section 3 of the Act;
 - 19.1.8 "Deputy Mayor" means the Deputy Mayor of the Council;
 - 19.1.9 "director" means a member of the Authority appointed in accordance with clause 4;
 - 19.1.10 "Director Community and Economic Development" means the employee of the Council appointed to hold that position;
 - 19.1.11 "Eligible Children" being children aged up to 7 years with ASD;
 - 19.1.12 "General Manager" means the General Manager of the Council;
 - 19.1.13 "Mayor" means the Mayor of the Council.


