LIVING MARINE RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1995

FISHERIES (SCALLOP) RULES 2010

NOTICE FOR THE TASMANIAN SCALLOP FISHERY COMPRISING ACTIVITIES BY WAY OF FISHING FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES -

I, Grant Pullen, Acting Director (Marine Resources), Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment, pursuant to the delegated authority under Section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*, in accordance with the *Fisheries (Scallop) Rules 2010*, hereby:

1. Specify under Rule 16(1)(c) of the Rules, the amount of scallops that may be taken or possessed in total from all areas of the commercial scallop fishery determined to be open under the provisions of Rule 16(1)(a) of the Rules is increased to 1033 tonnes, this amount being inclusive of the 620 tonnes previously specified by Public Notice published in State newspapers on 1 July 2015 and in Gazette No. 21 527 on 1 July 2015;
2. Set under Rule 20(2)(b) of the Rules, the maximum percentage of scallop quota units that may be taken in total by the holder of a Fishing Licence (scallop) in the 2015 Open Season is increased to 25%, this amount being inclusive of the 15% previously set by Public Notice published in State newspapers on 1 July 2015 and in Gazette No. 21 527 on 1 July 2015.
3. Season dates, specified open areas and size limits remain as determined previously and set by Public Notice published in State newspapers on 1 July 2015 and in Gazette No. 21 527 on 1 July 2015.
