## Emergency Management

### EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ACT 2006

A state of emergency has been declared in Tasmania arising from the presence in this State of the coronavirus disease COVID-19. In the exercise of the powers conferred by me under Section 40 of the *Emergency Management Act 2006* and pursuant to clauses 1(1)(b) and 1(1)(q) of Schedule 1 to the Act, I make the following directions:

1. Every person who arrives in Tasmania is required to isolate himself or herself for 14 days from contact with all persons other than persons with whom he or she ordinarily resides; and
2. Every person who arrives in Tasmania is required to answer any question asked by an authorised officer or to provide any document or other information required by an authorised officer that is in the control of the person.

Direction 1 does not apply to a person who is specified in the attached Schedule unless that person has arrived in Australia from overseas within the last 14 days.

This authorisation takes effect immediately and has effect until further notice.

I hereby revoke with immediate effect the directions made by me on 26 March 2020 under the *Emergency Management Act* exercising the powers specified in clauses 1(1)(b) and 1(1)(q) of Schedule 1 to the Act.

## SCHEDULE SPECIFIED PERSONS

### 1. National and State Security and Governance

- (a) Any Government Senior Official who, in the carriage of his or her duties, is responsible for the safety of the Nation or Tasmania against threats such as terrorism, war, or espionage, and is required to be present in Tasmania for such purposes; and
- (b) Active Military personnel required to be on duty in Tasmania while in Tasmania; and
- (c) A member of the Commonwealth Parliament who is ordinarily resident in Tasmania.

### 2. Health Services

- (a) Any specialists required for industry or business continuity and maintenance of competitive operations where the appropriate skills are not available in Tasmania, where the service is time-critical and where the provision of the service requires that the person be physically present in Tasmania; and
- (b) Any person who, in the carriage of his or her duties, is responsible, while in Tasmania, for critical maintenance or repair of infrastructure critical to Tasmania.

### 5. Paramedics and ambulance officers

- (a) A paramedic, or an officer of Ambulance Tasmania, each within the meaning of the *Ambulance Service Act 1982*, who is returning to Tasmania as soon as practicable after providing medical transport to a patient or who is returning to Tasmania while providing medical transport to a person; and
- (b) A paramedic, or an officer of Ambulance Tasmania, each within the meaning of the *Ambulance Service Act 1982*, who is ordinarily resident in Tasmania and who is requested by the Commissioner of Ambulance Services, or his or her delegate, to return to Tasmania to present for duty in Tasmania.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ACT 2006  
REGULATION OF AIRCRAFT MOVEMENT

In the exercise of the powers conferred on me under Section 40 of the *Emergency Management Act 2006* and pursuant to clause 1(1)(b) of Schedule 1 to the Act, I hereby prohibit any aeroplane or aircraft whose flight commences outside Tasmania from landing (other than in the case of an emergency or with my prior consent) at any place within Tasmania other than at the following airports:

- Hobart International (Strachan Street, Cambridge)
- Cambridge Aerodrome (115 Kennedy Drive, Cambridge)
- Launceston (201 Evandale Road, Western Junction, Launceston)
- Devonport (Airport Road, Devonport)
- Burnie (3 Airport Street, Wynyard)
- King Island (Morrison Avenue, Looorana)
- Flinders Island (122 Palana Road, Whitemark)

This authorisation takes effect immediately and has effect until further notice.

I hereby revoke with immediate effect the direction made by me on 23 March 2020 under the *Emergency Management Act* exercising the powers specified in clause 1 (1)(b) of Schedule 1 to the Act in relation to the regulation of aircraft movement.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ACT 2006  
DIRECTIONS IN RELATION TO KING ISLAND, FLINDERS  
ISLAND AND ISLANDS IN THE FURNEAUX GROUP  
OF ISLANDS

A state of emergency has been declared in Tasmania arising from the presence in this State of the coronavirus disease COVID-19. In the exercise of the powers conferred by me under Section 40 of the *Emergency Management Act 2006* and pursuant to clauses 1(1)(b) and 1(1)(q) of Schedule 1 to the Act, I make the following directions:

1. No resident of Tasmania is to travel to King Island unless they are a resident of the island.
2. No resident of Tasmania is to travel to Flinders Island or any island in the Furneaux group of islands unless they are a resident of Flinders Island or one of the islands in the Furneaux group of islands.
3. Any resident of King Island, Flinders Island or any island in the Furneaux group of islands returning to their island of residence from elsewhere in Tasmania is required to isolate himself or herself for 14 days from contact with all persons other than persons with whom he or she ordinarily resides;
4. Every person who arrives on King Island, Flinders Island or any island in the Furneaux group of islands is required to answer any question asked by an authorised officer or to provide any document or other information required by an authorised officer that is in the control of the person.
5. Direction 3 does not apply to:
  - (i) a resident of King island if they have returned from Flinders island or one of the islands in the Furneaux group of islands;
  - (ii) a resident of Flinders island if they have returned from King island or one of the islands in the Furneaux group of islands;
  - (iii) a resident of an island in the Furneaux group of islands if they have returned from Flinders island or King island.
6. Directions 1, 2 and 3 do not apply to a person who is specified in the attached Schedule unless that person has arrived in Australia from overseas within the last 14 days.

Direction 1 does not apply to a person who is specified in the attached Schedule unless that person has arrived in Australia from overseas within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania.

1. Every person who arrives in Tasmania after 11.59pm on 29 March 2020 from a departure point outside of Tasmania is required to isolate himself or herself for 14 days at an accommodation facility specified to them by an authorised officer under the *Emergency Management Act*.
2. Persons subject to Direction 1 are to comply with any lawful directions given to them by an authorised officer during the period they are required to remain in isolation.
3. Persons subject to Direction 1 are to remain in the room provided to them at the accommodation facility specified to them for the period they are required to remain in isolation unless permitted to leave their room by an authorised officer.
4. Direction 1 does not apply to families who are residents of Tasmania who arrive with children 17 years of age or younger unless any member of the family has arrived in Australia from overseas within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania or disembarked from a cruise ship within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania. In such a case, subject to Direction 8 all members of the arriving family are subject to Direction 1.
5. Persons who are not subject to Direction 1 by virtue of Direction 4 are required to isolate in their primary residence in Tasmania for a period of 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania.
6. Direction 1 does not apply to persons 17 years of age and under who are residents of Tasmania who have travelled to Tasmania unaccompanied by an adult unless they have arrived in Australia from overseas within 14 days of their arrival in



Tasmania or disembarked from a cruise ship within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania. In such a case, subject to Direction 8 they are subject to Direction 1.

7. Persons who are not subject to Direction 1 by virtue of Direction 6 are required to isolate in their primary residence in Tasmania for a period of 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania.
8. Direction 1 does not apply to a person who is specified in the attached Schedule unless that person has arrived in Australia from overseas within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania or disembarked from a cruise ship within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania. Such persons are subject to Direction 1.
9. Persons specified in the attached Schedule who have not arrived in Australia from overseas within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania or disembarked from a cruise ship within 14 days of their arrival in Tasmania are required to comply with the directions made by the Director of Public Health under Section 16 of the Public Health Act on 20 March 2020 a copy of which are annexed hereto as Annexure A.

This authorisation takes effect immediately and has effect for a period of 12 weeks.

I hereby revoke with immediate effect the directions made by acting State Controller Tilyard on 28 March 2020 under Section 40 of the Emergency Management Act 2006 and pursuant to clauses 1(1)(b) of Schedule 1 to the Act.

## ANNEXURE A

### PUBLIC HEALTH ACT 1997

#### DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 16

I, MARK VEITCH, the Director of Public Health, in pursuance of section 16 of the *Public Health Act 1997*, in order to manage a threat to public health or a likely threat to public health posed by the disease known as COVID-19 (“the disease”), direct that each person who is within a class of persons specified in the Schedule to this direction and who arrives in Tasmania at any time on or after 20 March 2020 must, during the period of 14 days after he or she arrives in Tasmania, or for so long as there is an emergency declaration in effect, whichever is the shorter period (“the relevant period”) –

- (a) take all reasonable steps to ensure that he or she will not be expected to sleep in the same room as another person or will not be residing in a dormitory or accommodation like a dormitory; and
- (b) monitor himself or herself for symptoms of fever, coughing, sore throat, muscular pains, shortness of breath or unexpected tiredness, which may be evidence that he or she is infected by the disease; and
- (c) if he or she believes he or she is displaying a symptom referred to in paragraph (b) –
  - (i) cease to attend a place, other than a place referred to in sub-paragraph (ii), for the purposes of work; and
  - (ii) as far as is reasonably practicable without putting his or her survival at risk, remain in, or return and remain in –
    - A. the premises that are his or her ordinary place of residence; or
    - B. if he or she does not ordinarily reside in Tasmania – the premises where he or she is temporarily residing while in Tasmania –

except as necessary to attend at premises, nominated by his or her medical practitioner or the advisor on the Public Health Hotline, for the purposes of being tested for the presence of the disease or to obtain goods or services reasonably necessary for the preservation of life; and

- (iii) contact the Public Health Hotline, or a medical practitioner, to determine whether to be tested or assessed for infection by the disease; and
- (d) as far as reasonably practicable, when outside premises referred to in paragraph (c)(ii), only be within 1.5 metres of any other person –
  - (i) for the purposes of obtaining supplies or services necessary for his or her bodily maintenance and that cannot be arranged for by use of electronic means such as internet shopping; or
  - (ii) for the purposes of testing or assessment for infection by the disease; or
  - (iii) if the Secretary of the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment, or his or her delegate, exempts the person on compassionate grounds from the requirement of this paragraph in relation to the other person; and
- (e) cover his or her mouth when coughing or sneezing; and
- (f) use disposable tissues, and dispose of such tissues, after use, in a waste receptacle that other people will not touch except if protected from contact with the receptacle or its contents; and
- (g) wash his or her hands frequently and thoroughly with soap, or an alcohol-based sanitizing chemical, especially after using a toilet, before and after eating and before and after returning from outdoors; and
- (h) if the person –
  - (i) is within a category referred to in paragraph 2 or 5 of the Schedule; or
  - (ii) is otherwise in close contact with a person who, by virtue of the characteristics of the person, ought reasonably be regarded as especially vulnerable to infection or serious illness due to the disease (a “vulnerable person”) –

ensure that he or she, at all times when engaged in the provision of health services or health care to persons, or is in close proximity to a vulnerable person, wears a surgical mask or wears other personal protective equipment that is normally worn during such contact by persons engaged in the provision of those health services or that health care.

### SCHEDULE SPECIFIED PERSONS

#### 1. National and State Security and Governance

- (a) Any Government senior official who in the carriage of his or her duties is responsible for the safety of the Nation or Tasmania against threats such as terrorism, war, or espionage, and is required to be present in Tasmania for such purposes; and
- (b) Active Military personnel required to be on duty in Tasmania while in Tasmania; and
- (c) A member of the Commonwealth Parliament who is ordinarily resident in Tasmania.

#### 2. Health Services

- (a) A clinician in relation to health who is ordinarily resident in Tasmania and who is requested by the Secretary of the Department of Health, or his or her delegate, to return to Tasmania to present for duty in Tasmania; and
- (b) A clinician in relation to health who is requested by the Secretary of the Department of Health, or his or her

delegate, to present for duty in Tasmania to perform, during the period in which the person will be present in Tasmania, duties unable to be appropriately performed by a person ordinarily resident in Tasmania.

#### 3. Transport, freight and logistics

- (a) Any person who in the carriage of his or her duties is responsible for provision of transport or freight and logistics into, within and out of Tasmania; and
- (b) Flight crew and ship crew –  
for the purpose of delivery of persons, freight or logistics into, within and out of Tasmania.

#### 4. Specialist skills critical to maintaining key industries or businesses

- (a) Any specialists required for industry or business continuity and maintenance of competitive operations where the appropriate skills are not available in Tasmania, where the service is time-critical and where the provision of the service requires that the person be physically present in Tasmania; and
- (b) Any person who, in the carriage of his or her duties, is responsible, while in Tasmania, for critical maintenance or repair of infrastructure critical to Tasmania; and
- (c) Any person travelling from Antarctica directly to Tasmania.

#### 5. Paramedics and ambulance officers

- (a) A paramedic, or an officer of Ambulance Tasmania, each within the meaning of the *Ambulance Service Act 1982*, who is returning to Tasmania as soon as practicable after providing medical transport to a patient or who is returning to Tasmania while providing medical transport to a person; and
- (b) A paramedic, or an officer of Ambulance Tasmania, each within the meaning of the *Ambulance Service Act 1982*, who is ordinarily resident in Tasmania and who is requested by the Commissioner of Ambulance Services, or his or her delegate, to return to Tasmania to present for duty in Tasmania.

#### 6. Other persons, or class of persons, exempted by the State Controller

- (a) Any other person, or member of a class of persons, in relation to whom, in the opinion of the Secretary DPIPWE, self-quarantine would lead to an unusual, undeserved or disproportionate hardship; and
- (b) Any other person, or member of a class of persons, who, in the opinion of the Secretary DPIPWE, is essential for the proper functioning of Tasmania.

## SINGLE-USE PLASTICS BY-LAW

## BY-LAW No. 1 of 2019

## PART 1 – PRELIMINARY

1. This by-law is made pursuant to section 145 of the Act for the purpose of preventing, so as to minimise environmental pollution and reduce litter, the provision by retailers of certain single-use plastic food packaging.

2. This by-law may be cited as the Single-Use Plastics By-law.

3. This by-law applies to the Hobart municipal area.

4. In this by-law:

**Act** means the *Local Government Act 1993*;

**authorised officer** means an employee of the Council authorised by the General Manager for the purposes of this by-law;

**barrier bag** means as defined in the *Plastic Shopping Bags Ban Act 2013*;

**compostable** means, when treated in an industrial composting facility, the following requirements are met:

- (a) 60% decomposition (aerobic) within 180 days;
- (b) 90% disintegration to less than 2mm in 84 days; and
- (c) is non-toxic;

**Council** means the Hobart City Council;

**food** means any substance or thing of a kind used, or represented as



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being for use, for human consumption, including any substance which is consumed as a drink;

**food packaging** means any container which is used to carry food from a retailer's premises to the point where the food is consumed, and related items, including but not limited to:

- (a) tubs and lids;
- (b) cups and cup lids;
- (c) utensils, including cutlery, stirrers and straws; and
- (d) sachets or packets which provide single serves of condiments, including but not limited to soy sauce, wasabi, and tomato sauce;

**General Manager** means the General Manager of the Council appointed pursuant to section 61 of the Act;

**industrial composting facility** means a commercial scale facility which provides composting services at a minimum temperature of 55°C for at least 15 days (which may be non-consecutive) during the composting period;

**non-toxic** means that the following tests are satisfied:

- (a) *Plant germination test.* The germination rate and the plant biomass from a sample compost (using compost derived from the food packaging) shall be more than 90% of the germination rate and the plant biomass from a sample compost which does not contain the food packaging.
- (b) *Packaging composition test.* The food packaging will not exceed the following elemental limits: Zn 1400mg/kg, Cu 750 mg/kg, Ni 210 mg/kg, Cd 17 mg/kg, Pb 150 mg/kg, Hg 8.5mg/kg, Se 50mg/kg, As 20.5 mg/kg.

**person** means an individual, corporation or any other legal entity (other than the Crown);

**plastic** means a material that contains large molecular weight organic

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polymeric substances as an essential ingredient, but does not include plastic which is compostable;

**plastic shopping bag** means as defined in the *Plastic Shopping Bags Ban Act 2013*;

**related entity** means as defined in the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth);

**retailer** means a person who sells food;

**retailer's premises** means the premises which is owned or occupied by a retailer;

**single-use product** means a product that is not conceived, designed or placed on the market to accomplish, within its life span, multiple use by being returned to the retailer for refill or re-used for the same purpose for which it was conceived.

## PART 2 – APPLICATION

5. This by-law applies where a retailer provides or sells food to be taken from the retailer's premises in food packaging.
6. This by-law does not apply where a retailer provides or sells food in food packaging where:
  - (a) the food will be consumed at the retailer's premises; and
  - (b) no food packaging is taken from the retailer's premises.
7. Except in relation to sachets or packets which provide single serves of condiments, this by-law does not apply to food which has been packaged by a person who is not the retailer, or a related entity of the retailer.
8. This by-law does not apply to any food packaging which exceeds:
  - (a) an area equivalent to A4 (210mm by 297mm); or

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- (b) 1 litre in volume.
9. This by-law does not apply to plastic shopping bags or barrier bags.
10. This by-law does not apply where a retailer provides or sells food in food packaging where:
- (a) the food packaging has been provided by the person who is receiving the food from the retailer (the **customer**); and
  - (b) the customer was not provided with the food packaging by the retailer, or a related entity of the retailer.
11. This by-law does not apply to food packaging which has been certified, by the Australasian Bioplastics Association or a similar organisation, as complying with any of the following:
- (a) Australian Standard AS4736-2006 *Biodegradable plastics – Biodegradable plastics suitable for composting and other microbial treatment* (as amended by Amendment No. 1 published on 21 October 2009), by Standards Australia;
  - (b) European Standard EN13432 *Requirements for packaging recoverable through composting and biodegradation - Test scheme and evaluation criteria for the final acceptance of packaging*; or
  - (c) United States of American standard: D6400 *Standard Specification for Labeling of Plastics Designed to be Aerobically Composted in Municipal or Industrial Facilities*, published by ASTM International.

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**PART 3 – PROVIDING PLASTICS****Plastic food packaging not to be provided**

12. A retailer must not provide to a person any food packaging which is:
- (a) wholly or partly comprised of plastic; and
  - (b) a single-use product.

Penalty: 8 penalty units

**PART 4 – INFRINGEMENT NOTICES**

13. In this Part:

**specified offence** means an offence against the clause specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this by-law.

14. An authorised officer may issue an infringement notice to a person in respect of a specified offence and the penalty payable under the infringement notice for that offence is the penalty specified in Column 3 of the Schedule to this by-law.
15. An authorised officer may:
- (a) issue an infringement notice to a person who the authorised officer has reason to believe is guilty of a specified offence; and
  - (b) issue one infringement notice in respect of more than one specified offence.
16. The *Monetary Penalties Enforcement Act 2005* applies to an infringement notice issued under this by-law.

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17. A person who is served with an infringement notice must, within 28 days of the date of service, do one or more of the following:
  - (a) pay the monetary penalty in full to the General Manager;
  - (b) apply to the General Manager for withdrawal of the infringement notice;
  - (c) apply to the General Manager for a variation of payment conditions;  
or
  - (d) lodge with the General Manager a notice of election to have the offence or offences set out in the infringement notice heard and determined by a court.
18. If a person who has been served with an infringement notice fails to take one or more of the actions required by clause 17 within the prescribed time, the infringement may be referred to the Director, Monetary Penalties.
19. In addition to a penalty imposed in relation to a failure to comply with or a contravention of this by-law, any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of that failure or contravention is recoverable by the Council as a debt payable by the person so failing to comply or contravening.





## Living Marine Resources

### LIVING MARINE RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1995

#### FISHERIES (BIOSECURITY) ORDER 2020

Pursuant to the powers under section 270 of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995* (“the Act”) that were delegated to the Director (Marine Resources) on 12 November 2018 by the Minister acting pursuant to section 20(1) of the Act I make the following order:

#### 1. Short title

This order may be cited as the *Fisheries (Biosecurity) Order 2020*.

#### 2. Specification

This order is made –

- (a) in respect of the harmful disease *abalone viral ganglioneuritis*; and
- (b) to implement treatment and testing requirements designed to prevent the introduction or re-introduction of that disease into State waters.

#### 3. Directions issued

- (1) That an abalone processor must, unless otherwise authorised, ensure that no abalone live-holding water is discharged into State waters from any holding premises used under the relevant licence unless that water has –
  - (a) been treated using a system capable of achieving, on comparing water immediately prior to entering treatment with water immediately on leaving treatment, a minimum 3 log 10 reduction in total marine heterotrophic bacteria; and
  - (b) achieved a discharge concentration value of  $<3 \log 10$  ( $\leq 999$  bacterial colony forming units per mL).
- (2) That an abalone processor must, in each of the testing periods –
  - (a) cause a water sample to be taken by an agent of an approved service from each holding premises used under the relevant licence; and
  - (b) cause the water sample to be tested by an approved laboratory for the discharge concentration value referred to in subclause (1)(b); and
  - (c) submit the results of that testing to the Secretary.
- (3) That an abalone processor must allow access to any holding premises used under the relevant licence to any officer of the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment for the purposes of –
  - (a) inspecting the abalone live-holding water treatment system;
  - (b) inspecting any abalone held on the premises;
  - (c) seizing any suspected diseased abalone for testing; and
  - (d) taking a water sample for testing for the discharge concentration value referred to in subclause (1)(b).

#### 4. Interpretation

In this order –

“abalone” means live fish of the genus *Haliotis*;

“abalone processor” means the holder of a fish processing licence that authorises the processing of abalone;

“approved laboratory” means a laboratory approved to conduct tests relevant to ascertaining performance related to the standards in subclauses 3(1)(a) and 3(1)(b);

“approved service” means a service approved to take samples to be provided for testing by an approved laboratory;

“Tasmania’s biosecurity regions” means the regions specified in Part 1 and defined in Part 2 of the Schedule to this order;

“holding premises” means premises used to hold abalone taken from outside the relevant biosecurity region for those premises;

“introduction” includes re-introduction;

“relevant biosecurity region”, for premises, means, with reference to Tasmania’s biosecurity regions, the biosecurity region adjacent to that part of the State’s coastline where, or closest to where, those premises are situated;

“relevant licence”, for an abalone processor, means the fish processing licence that authorises the abalone processor to process abalone;

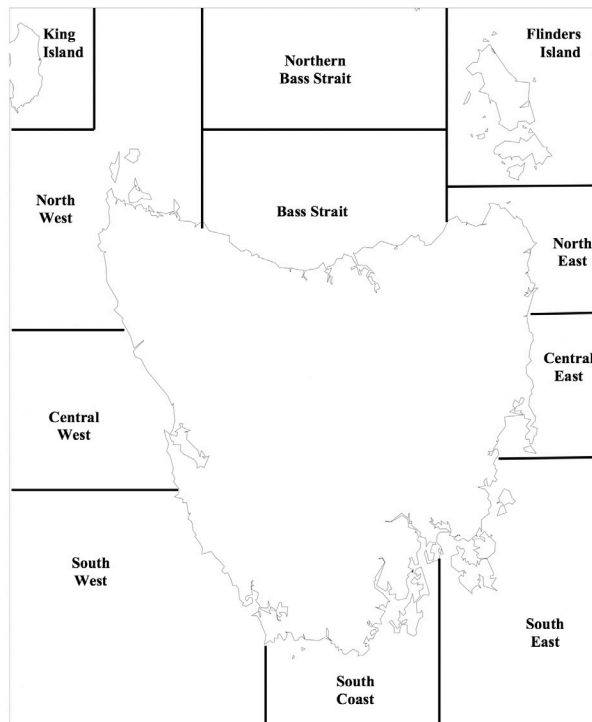
“testing periods” means the following periods:

- (a) October of each calendar year;
- (b) the four week period commencing six weeks before each Chinese New Year.
